


# HCHS FOUNDATION

The Uniform Holiday Bill

The Uniform Holiday Bill On June 28, 1968, the Uniform Holiday Bill is signed, moving the observance of Veterans Day from November 11 to the fourth Monday in October, effective in 1971. However, many states did not agree with this ransition and continued to celebrate Veterans Day on November 11 because of its historic significance to Armistice Day.

Congress passes legislation making Armistice Day, November 11, a legal Federal holiday.




